**“Mandy Picks A Husband” Premieres at the 2019 Hollywood Fringe
A Solo Dramedy Written and Performed by Amanda Broomell**

Los Angeles, CA (May 17, 2019) – Fans of powerful and hilarious personal stories brought to life on stage will delight in the world premiere of the solo dramedy *Mandy Picks A Husband*. Writer and performer Amanda Broomell brings her raw and witty tale to the 2019 Hollywood Fringe Festival for seven performances at The Little Theater at The Actors Company, previewing on Saturday, June 8th at 4:30 pm.

Mandy Picks A Husband found its initial inspiration when Broomell launched an Instagram experiment featuring tell-all videos about her adventures in online dating. With a wealth of rough but rich material at her fingertips, Broomell leapt into Terrie Silverman’s renowned Solo-Show Master Class, committed to crafting a one-person show. *Mandy Picks A Husband* is a story of self-discovery and lifelong commitment. Mandy, nearing 40, living alone in LA with her 13-year-old cat, takes the audience on a hilarious 60-minute rollercoaster ride as she relives her odyssey to find the perfect life partner while simultaneously searching to find herself. Through twists and turns, laughs and tears, Mandy continuously spins from boyfriend to boyfriend, from self-help coach to healer, from empowerment retreat to spiritual retreat, on a quest to unearth the magic elixir for her unmarried soul. We join Mandy for every romantic challenge she faces, and cheer her on through countless intuitive readings and love coaching sessions. Has this journey of self-improvement fully prepared Mandy to find *The One*? Or is there something unresolved clouding the way?
